Gleadell's new £3.26 million store at Immingham is located at the heart of the region's grain-producing farmland and can hold some 25,000 tonnes of grain. It will give farmers in the region a full drying facility at an end user destination without the need for their capital commitment. Our mobile shiploader at the facility can handle 1,200 tonnes of grain per hour giving the capacity to load in excess of 250 wagons of UK grain for export in a typical loading day. The Immingham facility handles wheat, barley, oilseed rape and pulses from the region's farms – all destined for customers in the Mediterranean, Northern Europe, Scandinavia, Ireland and destinations outside the EU.
